Richmond said they expect an increase in the number of entries in the mini garden tractor pull on Saturday night. He said they have 72 entries for the fair parade on Saturday including bands, floats and there's been some interest in kids decorating their bicycles and taking part in the parade.

As of Monday, seven girls were entered in the 46th edition of the Miss Acton pageant that takes place at 8 p.m. on Friday night after the official opening of the fair, featuring the Acton Citizens' Band, at 7 p.m.


