- Development of a promotion and communication plan for Museum and Resource Centre.
 - Development of outreach programs with school boards, service clubs, recreation and parks department and local community. Outreach programs need to be educational and shall be financially sustainable.
 - Manage membership database and communication to members, including recruitment of new members.
 - Develop a business plan including fundraising and sponsorship strategies to assist in museum sustainability and to be self-supporting.
 - Develop and implement a research, collections and conservation program including preserving and cataloging using approved software. Responsible for set up of displays and exhibits to increase attendance and to maximize exposure.

 - Develop opportunities for volunteers, local sporting groups, schools, service clubs etc. to become partners and to contribute to the museum.

 - Design a plan to make the museum financially self-supporting.
