"We're disappointed by this decision," said Steve Koch, Executive Director of NAIMA Canada. "This was a wonderful program that did exactly what it was supposed to do and more. It was one of the government's most impactful programs to deal with climate change and energy efficiency.

Homeowners were rewarded for making their homes more energy efficient, and hundreds of green jobs were created."

Provincial governments have been matching Ottawa's incentives with their own retrofit programs, and developing mandatory labelling to help educate and motivate consumers to develop an energy efficient home.

We now have to look to Premiers like Dalton McGuinty to enact the mandatory labelling in order to support the auditors and the industry."
