Rural sustainability

Halton Hills is urging Statistics Canada to reverse its decision to terminate funding for the Rural Research Group that provides Ottawa with the data and analysis needed to support a comprehensive agenda on rural sustain-

Regional/Acton Councilor Clark Somerville, a member of the rural forum of the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM), said the funding cut was a bureaucratic decision.

"FCM has been advocating for the last couple of years to have a rural champion at the Cabinet table...20 per cent of Canada's population still lives in the rural area," Somerville said.

Regional/Georgetown Councillor Jane Fogal said it is a "terrible time for the rural issues to fall off the table" as they debate sustainability, and sustainable food production.

"Here is the problem. The rural area doesn't have enough votes. It's as simple as that," Fogal said, adding FCM will make it an issue unless the government doesn't "get back on."

Mayor Rick Bonnette said Statistics Canada's decision to end funding of the Rural Research Group is very serious" and a set back for rural areas.
