Halton water use - know your limits

Due to an unusually dry winter and the recent high temperatures Halton Region is reminding residents to be mindful of their outdoor water use in order to ensure there is enough water for essential and emergency services like firefighting.

Residents are asked to "know your colour, know your limits" by following Halton's Outdoor Water Use Program which consists of a numeric and colour coded system. The program establishes three levels of outdoor water use based on criteria such as water demand, water treatment reservoir levels, aquifer levels (groundwater) and weather patterns.

"As the warmer weather is now upon us and homeowners are in the middle of lawn and gardening season, it is very important for residents to learn about the water restriction levels in order to reduce consumption when required," said Halton's Regional Chair Gary Carr. "Water consumption can double in the summer months making it imperative that we all be mindful of our water use in order to ensure there is enough for the services that need it the most."

Levels of the Outdoor Water Use Program include:

Level 1 (Blue) - Careful Use. Voluntary odd/even lawn watering between 6 o'clock and 9 o'clock in the morning and evening on days that

correspond with your house number (if your house number starts with an odd number, water on any odd numbered calendar day and similarly for even numbered addresses). Car washing and watering of trees, shrubs and gardens is allowed on those days.

All Halton municipalities are currently under a Blue, Level 1 water restriction. Residents are asked to be mindful of their outdoor water use by voluntarily following the odd/even watering rule to help prevent entering into any additional water restrictions.

Level 2 (Yellow) - Limited Use. Mandatory odd/even lawn watering between 6 o'clock and 9 o'clock in the morning

and evening on days that correspond with your house number. Watering of trees, shrubs and gardens should be done using a hand held device such as a watering can.

Level 3 (Red) - Stop Use. No outdoor lawn watering or car washing is permitted in order to conserve water for emergency and essential services. Watering of trees, shrubs and gardens can be done using a hand held device following the odd/even watering rule.

Proposed Regional Official Plan Amendment No. 40 (ROPA 40)
"Servicing Public Uses Outside the Urban Area"

Applicant: Halton Region

Halton Regional Council, through its Planning and Public Works Committee, has scheduled a Statutory Public Meeting to provide the public an opportunity to make presentations to the Planning and Public Works Committee with respect to the proposed amendments to the Halton Region Official Plan, 2006, as set out in proposed ROPA 40, pursuant to Section 17 of the Planning Act.

Those not registered, but wishing to address the Committee should register with the Clerk prior to the public meeting.

Purpose and Effect: The purpose of this amendment is to identify the following four areas as being eligible for water and wastewater services, based on the nature of the public use and location:

- Halton Waste Management Site, 5400 Regional Road 25, Milton
- Biosolids Management Centre, 4449 Regional Road 25, Oakville
- The proposed Milton Works Yard, 5600 Regional Road 25, Milton
- Robert C. Austin Operations Centre, 11618 Trafalgar Road, Halton Hills.

This Amendment will also establish policies to allow the Region to consider Regional Official Plan Amendments to allow additional public uses to be eligible for urban servicing subject to criteria.

To ensure all comments are considered, the public is invited to provide written submissions on proposed ROPA 40 to Sarah Cannon on or before June 16, 2010. This submission deadline will permit Regional Council to deliberate the adoption of this Amendment on July 14, 2010.

Note: If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to The Regional Municipality of Halton before the proposed ROPA 40 is adopted, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of Halton Regional Council to the Ontario Municipal Board.

If a person or public body does not make submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to The Regional Municipality of Halton before the proposed ROPA 40 is adopted, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

If you wish to be notified of the adoption of the proposed Official Plan Amendment, you must make a written request to the Regional Clerk at Halton Region, 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville, Ontario L6M 3L1.
