The Roxy has room for 240 (plus an additional 60 outside in the coffee shop), so come out to cheer for your favourite band. Admission is \$5 and the judges include Mark Gross, a professional band promoter and owner of Classic Entertainment Productions. Prizes include a \$100 gift certificate at Long and McQuaid, performance at Acton's Canada Day festivities, and a master recording at a professional recording studio.

On Saturday, June 19, the popular "Taste of Acton" is back by popular demand for the fourth year. Seven restaurants in Downtown Acton will play host to Dads and their hungry friends from 2 to 6 p.m. Proceeds will help fund the Acton Soccer Club. What a lovely excuse to overeat. Passports are available for \$12 in advance (\$15 the day of) and the "tasters" will be able to enjoy food at any five restaurants of their choice.

At 4 p.m. there will be a Talent Show and Karaoke at the Rotary Bandshell in Prospect Park. You don't have to



audition and all ages are invited to participate. The Rotary will supply the mics, karaoke, CD players, etc. So if you can sing and dance (or at least you THINK you can), come on out to the Talent show and strut your stuff. The show is free, and you are bound to be surprised at the talent we have in town. Bring your camera, though, in case someone does something really embarrassing. After the Talent Show, kids will be invited to color a giant mural of comic strip characters...fun for the little ones and for budding artists with real colouring talent.

Bring the kids to Prospect Park, where the Town of Halton Hills is hosting a "Mighty Machines" display. Kids and Dads can see a giant snowplow. Don't forget to bring your camera. At dusk, join the fun at Prospect Park as Party Cinemas presents *Ironman* on a jumbo movie screen. Free movie nights have become a tradition in Acton the past three years. Somehow it's more fun watching

a movie in the dark with a pile of people (with real stars above supplied by the biggest Daddy of them all!). Bring your lawn chairs, blankets, your kids and your sweetie. It's like the Drive-in, but with no back seat. Food Bank donations are encouraged, another three-year tradition.

Don't stay up too late, though, because the Acton Rotary Dad and Me Fishing Derby is being held from 7 to 11 a.m. on Fairy Lake. This is also an Acton tradition and Herb Dodds has an exciting lineup of prizes and activities for you and your Dad. If the fish aren't biting, you could have an important and deep conversation with your Dad....or not, if you like to avoid these types of things. Most of the fishing will be done from the shore, so land lubbers ahoy, you're invited too!

At 10 a.m. there will be three other exciting activities at Prospect Park to choose from. The first is a casting contest for kids and Dads. At 10 a.m., there will be a demonstration by members of the Izaak Walton Fly Fishing Club on how to tie flies (apparently this is a real art and it will be very interesting). At the same time, there will also be a fly casting demonstration and Dads will get a chance to try their hand at fly fishing. Members of the Greg Clarke Chapter of Trout Unlimited will be there to lead the demonstration.
