

Money to brand

Members of the Greater Toronto Countryside Mayors' Alliance – the "little guys" in Southern Ontario according to Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette, will receive an economic shot in the arm from the province.

At an Alliance meeting on Friday, members agreed to match the province's offer of \$25,000 for a study involving the area's economic development officers to "work on strategies for this area."


