Like glulam?

On budget and on time - that's the good news at the Acton library construction site as work is 'moving quickly.'

"It's getting exciting – now that the glulam has gone up, people are really talking about the project,' said project manager Geoff Cannon. Glulam is glued laminated timber, a type of structural timber product composed of several layers of lumber glued together.

The glulam beams will be visible on the roof. Once they are in place, crews will pour the

"We're still fine tuning the interior design – getting down to the final decisions on what piece of furniture will go where, and what that furniture is going to look like so our interior designer can cost it all to make sure it fits within the budget," Cannon said.

He said despite a large banner indicating the library remains open during construction, they have seen a dip in use.

"We're trying to draw people in to let them know that we are open. and to invite them to visit us and get a close up look at what is happening. From the upstairs windows you get a bird's eye view of the site and all that is happening," Cannon said.
