Construction begins on Acton fire hall

With no public debate or comment, Halton Hills councillors approved adding \$77,388 to the budget to expand and improve the Churchill Road fire

The contract for and replacement of the Fire Chief Brent Marshall said the upgrades would provide Acton with equivalent levels of service and staff facilities to those available in Georgetown. Chief Marshall said the two additions totalling 1,660-square-feet would provide new offices for the training division and utilize existing wiring for office computers and telephones for three fulltime firefighters.

> After all of the tenders submitted significantly exceeded the approved budget, the design was reworked to include two additions so services to the building would not have to be relocated. The budget included the cost of replacing one heating/

cooling system, but it was determined that it was not possible to put the existing heating/cooling system back on the roof after it was replaced, so the budget was increased to cover the cost of a second and third heating/cooling system.

As well as reworking the costs to bring it under budget, staff approached a number of local contractors to ask about "in-kind" donations, and Van Raine and Sons Snowplowing of Georgetown agreed to complete all of the excavation work – valued at 12,000 - on an in-kind

The Acton Firefighters Association has already raised the \$41,000 it pledged to the project, and Dufferin Aggregates will donate \$50,000 towards upgrades for the Heritage Museum.

While the Acton Firefighters Association and the fire department own many significant pieces of fire department memorabilia, the most prized possession is a 1927 Studebaker fire truck that will be displayed in the Heritage Museum, along with artifacts, including a collection of grainy black and white photographs of the bucket brigade that fought Acton fires in the mid-1800s.

Construction will begin tomorrow (Friday) and the project should be complete by Christmas.
