Far North politics
Talk about sticker shock. Eighteen dollars for a box of cornflakes, \$100 for a package of diapers and \$95 for a bag of dog food - those prices made Acton/Regional Councillor Clark Somerville glad he was just visiting Iqualuit, Nunavut earlier this month. Somerville travelled to the south coast of Baffin Island to attend a Board of Directors meeting for FCM - the Federation of Canadian Municipalities. Somerville said he was impressed with beauti-

ful and inexpensive Inuit carvings, the many hours of daylight and the "super friendly" population. He also enjoyed the fresh Arctic char and the "fresh perspective" that observing life in the tundra provided him. "September is always our priorities meeting where we decide our agenda for the coming year," Somerville said on Friday, adding he is vice-chair of the social-economic development committee that is researching a national food security policy.

"I was appointed to a task force that is going to look at municipal protocols and response to national disasters - like how the Halton EMS workers went to Haiti," Somerville said, adding other issues on the FCM agenda include preparations for the next Federal election and the long-form census. He said now that the policy directions are decided, they move to advocacy days next month when they sit down with MPs and MPPs to talk about municipal issues.

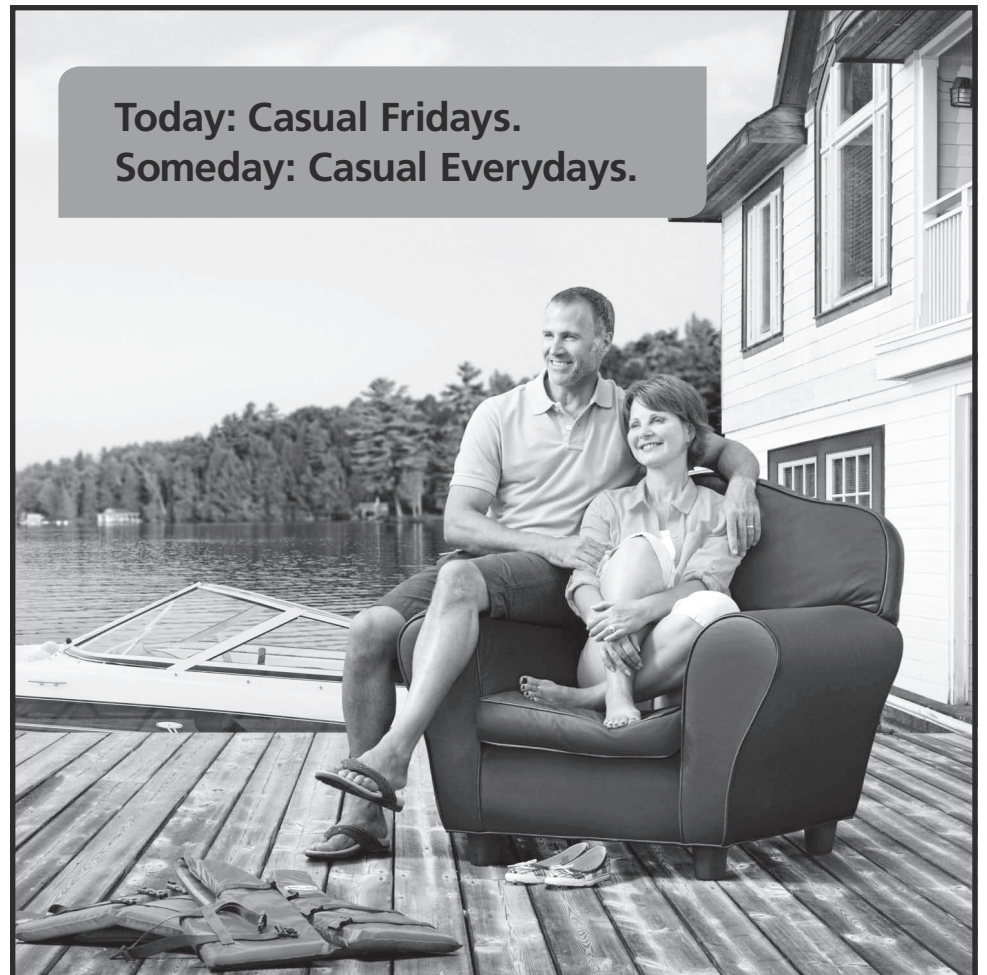
