> Shier said a ladder at the Hole in the Wall, a rock outcropping off of Fifth Line near the Bruce Trail was damaged - the vandals used the wood in a bonfire – and a "poop and scoop" station was stolen.

> "Apparently, they chopped down a tree with an axe to burn," Shier said, adding some of the signs had just been installed in June.

CVC property superintendent Brian Kristy said CVC staff had to help some hikers on Monday morning when they found part of the ladder missing and couldn't move along the trail.

"We've only found two of the hazardous area signs – one in the creek and one by the railroad tracks," Kristy said on Monday, adding "I don't get vandalism." He said a \$1,500 trail counter was also stolen from a wooden box, which was damaged.


