Brian Secord scored a pair of goals only two minutes apart in the second with help from defencemen Joshua Hamilton and Jacob Coleman. Secord's goals were quickly followed by an unassisted goal from Jack Kennedy, ending the period 4-0 Tanners. Kennedy earned his second goal of the night early in the third, this one assisted by Luke Miehm, who in turn scored himself with just over a minute left in the game off a pass from Secord. Tanners goalie Mathew Adkins played a stellar game, earning the Tanners' first shut out of the season.

On Thanksgiving weekend, the Tanners hosted the Arthur Vipers at Teen Ranch in Caledon and were thankful for a 13-2 victory. Miehm opened the scoring less than thirty seconds into the game, the assist going to Secord. That was followed a minute later by Cameron Shoebridge off a pass from defenceman Ben Gray. Shoebridge scored again before the end of the first,

Dylan Palmer and Hamilton helping out on that one. Hunter McCauley capitalized on a rebound after shots by Palmer and Shoebridge were blocked, and then Secord got one of his own with less than a minute left in the period, ending the first 5-0 Tanners.

Muise started the second period off with quick back-to-back goals. Linemates Thomas and Michael Holmes assisted on those. Shortly after, Arthur was on the board, but that goal was answered thanks to a rush but defenceman Jon Bydevaate, making it 8-1 Tanners. Arthur managed to get one more early in the first, but that would be their last. Miehm scored the next goal for the Tanners, assisted by Bydevaate and Secord, followed by a goal from Thomas after Hamilton cleared the puck from the Tanners zone. Kennedy scored the eleventh goal of the game with help from Muise, which was quickly followed by one from Shoebridge, earning him a hat-trick. Kennedy scored once more with less than a minute left, ending it 13-2 Tanners. The Atom AE Tanners face Woolwich at home on Saturday.
