Habitat help for low-income owners

Habitat for Humanity Halton is looking for lowincome homeowners in need of repairs for health and safety of the home, renovations for accessibility, and/or energy efficiency improvements that will lower costs.

"There are people in our community who purchased their homes, then ended up on reduced incomes or other changed life circumstances," said Anne Swarbrick, Executive Director, Habitat for Humanity Halton.

This could be the result of the economic downturn, health issues, or retirement. Some seniors or families need accessibility renovations to meet their changed health realities, but can't afford them. "Some people could have more money for other needs if home heating costs were reduced. Our new ReNew It program can help – if Halton residents who know of such homeowners will help ensure that they know about the program and encourage them to ask us for help." Swarbrick said.

This new program was created to enable Habitat for Humanity to help more people. After successfully completing two projects this year, and with grant support from the Region of Halton, Habitat Halton is now calling for applications for this fall.

Typical of Habitat for Humanity, the program involves "a hand up, not a hand out". ReNew It is based on an interestfree loan, allowing homeowners to make payments based on their income. While the loans will be for a maximum of \$10,000, the value of the work may be significantly more thanks to Habitat's volunteers who may add extra value for free, and to the potential for government programs like Ontario's Home Energy Savings Programs to help. The Ontario Home Energy Savings Program provides grants of up to \$5,000 for such things as improving insulation, replacing heating and cooling systems and water heaters provided work is complete by March 31,2011.

Even without government grants, the savings of energy efficiency improvements can save low-income families a lot of money," says Dave Cole, Habitat Halton's Construction Manager. "Homes generally cost about \$1,500 to heat and cool each year. Improving basement and attic insulation alone can save people hundreds of dollars annually."

As a charity, Habitat is restricted to helping people who live below the poverty line in Halton Region, which depends on factors such as the size of the family. For example, for families of four, the Halton poverty line is set at \$42,000. Additional program criteria include being a resident of Halton for at least two years. The deadline for this round of applications is November 15, but don't wait: applications will be dealt with as they are received.

Town pay deals

The Town is in the final year of a three year agreement with the Halton Hills Professional Fire Fighters Association which expires on December 31, 2010. The deal covers 24 members of the Fire Fighters and Communication Technicians and provided annual three percent salary increase as of January 1 each year.

The Town's 48 C.U.P.E. (Canadian Union of Public Employees) members

Recreation, Public Works and Parks/Cemeteries staff - signed a new threeyear deal last month that gives them 2.25 per cent increases each year with the first increase this June. Staff reported that some modest benefit increases were also included. After comparing salaries for administrative, technical and supervisory staff in neighbouring municipalities, council approved a two per cent wage increase
