
ACTON SENIORS' **RECREATION CENTRE** BY JULIE CONROY


There were two mooners at Thursday afternoon's Bid Euchre, Mary Irwin and Betty Brewer.

In cooperation with Library and Archives Canada, The War Amps is making the complete set of The Canadian Army Newsreels available to the public for the first time, as part of its Military Heritage Series.

Featuring more than 20 hours of footage, this six-DVD set contains 106 newsreels filmed and produced by the Canadian Army Film Unit. Army

cameramen documented the Canadian troops in training and on the front lines. They scooped the world on major events; including the invasion of Sicily and D-Day.

Members of Operation Legacy are donating The Canadian Army Newsreels to their local libraries to help spread the message of remembrance to their communities across Canada.
