## Rockwood woman completes destination marathon event

Along with her drive and stamina, Rockwood's Margaret Iutzi needed her passport to compete in the recent Niagara Falls International marathon.

"It was strange, waving to the boarder guards on the Peace Bridge," Iutzi (pronounced yoot see) said on Friday. The event, a fundraiser for cancer research, is the only marathon in the world which begins in one country – the United States – and ends in another – Canada.

Iutzi, 50, a personal fitness trainer and seniors' fitness programmer at a Guelph nursing home, had no illusions of speed as she prepared for the marathon – her first in 10 years. She finished the 42-kilometre course in 5 hours and 47-minutes.

"My goal was not to walk, except at the water stations, and at times, I did my version of running, but there was never any doubt I would finish," the former triathlete said on Saturday, adding it was a psychological, not physical challenge.

"I'm built for endurance, not speed," Iutzi said, adding the high point of the marathon was seeing "my guys" – her husband and son – at the finish line at the Horseshoe Falls.

A recent birthday was the catalyst to enter this marathon for Iutzi, who said she'd considered, but dismissed plans to do an Ironman competition, involving swimming, biking and running. It was not a tough run for Iutzi, who said the biggest hill was the Peace Bridge.
