Quarry crossings

Holcim (Canada) Inc. has Halton Hills permission to build three private underground crossings of the Nassagaweya-Esquesing Town Line, a boundary road under joint jurisdiction of Halton Hills and Milton

Last May, Halton Hills allowed the company to temporarily close the road for 10 years to facilitate quarrying at its Milton operation, and now the road closure and crossing licences expire in 2019. The quarry must provide adequate insurance, indemnity, security and a survey showing the exact locations of the crossings. The Town will hold \$2,000 as a security to ensure Holcim returns the road to its present condition when the deal expires.

User fees

While the cost of most Town user fees, licensing and program costs will increase by approximately three per cent, some increases are higher, and some will remain the same to be comparable with surrounding municipalities.

At its December 16 meeting, the newly sworn-in Town Council will be asked to approve a schedule of fee and rate increases, designed to re-

cover all or a portion of the direct costs of the service or program.

It will cost six per cent more (\$5.65) to replace a dog tag, 33.3 per

Ending for 2010

The last collection days of Yard Waste and Bulk Brush in 2010 are:

- Area 3: December 15
- Area 4: December 8
- Area 5: December 8

Urban Yard Waste collection will re-start in April 2011.

Acceptable Yard Waste Materials

- Leaves
- Decorative cornstalks
 Yard and garden trimmings
- Sticks & twigs
- Pumpkins
- Weeds

- Tree trimmings
- Fallen fruit from trees

Unacceptable Yard Waste Materials

- **Grass clippings**
- Tree stumps
- Clay
- Plastic shopping or Sod, soil, and rocks
 - garbage bags
- Plastic flower/ plant pots
- Flower/plant markers and tags

Yard Waste Tips

- Use paper yard waste bags or reusable, rigid containers (no lid).
- No plastic bags.
- Yard waste in cardboard boxes, Blue Boxes, GreenCarts, plastic bags, compostable bags or biodegradable bags will not be collected.
- Yard waste labels are available at no charge. To order a yard waste label, visit www.halton.ca/wastetools, or call Halton Region. Place yard waste labels on your reusable container.
- Containers must be no heavier than 23 kg (50 lbs) and may have a capacity up to 125 L.
- Brush must be tied in bundles no larger than 1.2 m x 0.6 m (4 ft x 2 ft) wide, with branches a maximum of 7.5 cm (3 in) in diameter.
