MPP Arnott zaps Liberal hydro rate policies

Skyrocketing hydro rates are becoming a serious hardship for many Ontario families—and it's about to get even worse, warned Wellington-Halton Hills MPP Ted Arnott.

"Residential electricity prices are expected to rise by 46 percent over the next five years, an average annual rate of about 7.9 percent," Arnott told ridiculed the Liberals'

the Ontario Legislature so-called "Ontario Clean last week, referencing the McGuinty government's own projections.

The Progressive Conservative caucus has established that rates have gone up 75 percent since the McGuinty government took office in 2003. In light of these numbers, Arnott later

Energy Benefit," which commits to a 10-percent rate cut. "After such massive increases, and all their broken promises, who will believe hydro rates are actually going down?"

In his remarks in the Legislature, Arnott read from an email he received from a single mother unable to afford to heat her

home: "I'm really concerned about how much I have to subtract from my grocery bill in order to keep the house warm and my son from getting sick ... I don't know where to turn but I'm sure hoping

you can help." The email also referenced the HST, which has already added eight percent to her hydro bill.

"In our area alone, there are thousands of families who already can't afford their hydro bills," Arnott later said. "It's a major problem and, when this government's even bigger increases kick in, it's only going to get worse."

Government releases list of hospital projects, finally

After months of delay, the province has finally released the list of hospital project proposals from across the province. In May, after receiving no answers from the McGuinty government, Wellington-Halton Hills MPP Ted Arnott filed a Freedom of Information request.

"Finally we have lifted at least some of the secrecy surrounding Ontario's hospital proposals," Arnott said on Tuesday. "But there's no excuse for delaying the release of this list, which it appears they had all along.'

The list shows 130 hospital proposals from across Ontario. However, it fails to provide all the information Arnott requested, including the status of the proposals and their estimated cost.

Arnott initially requested the list of all Ontario hospitals with construction and redevelopment proposals, the status of the proposals, including estimated completion dates, the estimated value and the date on which the proposals were submitted.

Groves Memorial Community Hospital in Fergus appears to be represented amongst the 130 proposals on the list. It shows a proposal as submitted in January 2008, with an estimated completion date of September 2012. The list gives no indication as to whether the Ministry is actually prepared to support the hospital in order to move forward with planning or when actual construction might commence.

Mr. Arnott intends to appeal to Information and Privacy Commissioner of Ontario in an effort to compel the government to release all the information he requested.

Speaking on Monday in the Legislature on the need for good government, Arnott again called attention to the Groves and Georgetown hospital proposals and the need for the Minister of Health to move ahead on those important proposals.
