a new warden – Guelph/ Eramosa Township Mayor Chris White was elected for a two-year term last Friday during a secret ballot at County Council.

This was the fourth election win for White in five months and follows his successful bids for election as chair of AMO (the Association of Municipalities of Ontario), chair of ROMA – the AMO rural caucus, and a repeat landslide win in the October 25 municipal election.

His challenger for the Warden's seat was County Councillor Gord Tosh, a former Eramosa councillor.

White said once he "gets his head around" all that the job entails – the meetings and committees – he County's relationship with Guelph, on a County-wide economic development plan and try to have the County meet more frequently, possibly with regular mayors' breakfasts.

"We have a lot of forward thinking people (on council) with a lot of experience. At first, it's a shock to have such a turnover, but we don't just want to manage the County, we want to be a leader," White said, adding Wellington is surrounded by strong Regions that both work with, and compete against, Wellington.

White said the important thing for him will be to not take his eye off the ball at the Township level, while being effective at the County level during his 24-month term.

As Warden's salary is \$79,226, annually.
