TRANSFORM AN OLD FAVORITE WITH CHOCOLATE FLAVOR

Every housewife knows that old-fashioned bread pudding, when it is carefully made, can be delicious. But bread pudding can be supremely delicious when to its old-fashioned goodness is added chocolate.

A chocolate bread pudding, served with whipped cream or hard sauce, becomes a dessert that is sure of an encore from every member of the family.

CHOCOLATE BREAD PUDDING

- 1 1/2 squares unsweetened chocolate
3 cups milk
2 eggs, slightly beaten
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 cubed stale bread

Add chocolate to milk and heat in double boiler. When chocolate is melted stir until blended. Combine eggs, sugar and salt; add chocolate mixture gradually, stirring vigorously. Add vanilla. Place bread in greased baking dish; pour mixture over it and let stand 10 minutes; then mix well before baking.

A REALLY NOVEL PUDDING

GINGER PUDDING

- 1 tablet for making junket
1 pint milk
1 tablespoon cold water
3 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon lemon flavoring
1/4 cup ginger cookies

Break a small ginger cookie (or leftover cake) in to each dessert dish. Dissolve tablet for making junket in 1 tablespoon cold water. Add sugar to milk, also lemon flavoring. Warm to lukewarm (110 degrees F.)—not hot, and remove from stove. Add dissolved tablet for making junket. Stir a few seconds, and pour at once over ginger cookies. Chill in refrigerator. Serve with whipped cream and a bit of grated preserved ginger.

FRUIT CARMELS

- Put through food chopper:
1 cup figs
1 cup seeded raisins
1 cup walnut meats
1 cup stoned dates
1 tablespoon candied orange peel
Molasses with:
2 to 4 tablespoons orange juice
until of right consistency to make into small balls. Roll in powdered sugar.

CANADA'S VINEYARD

While wine making does not occupy as prominent a position in the national economy of Canada as it does in some of the older countries of the world, it is nevertheless of considerable importance, and especially so to the fruit farmers of the Niagara Peninsula, here the industry is almost completely concentrated.

Although the wine trade is one of the oldest in the world, the planting of vineyards in Ontario is of comparatively recent origin, dating back to 1811. The Canadian grape and wine industry is based on a different type of grape than that grown in other countries. The Niagara, a white grape, which was introduced in 1823 and the Concord, a blue grape which originated in Concord, Massachusetts, are the principal varieties grown.
