TO PROTECT SHRUBS FROM DOGS

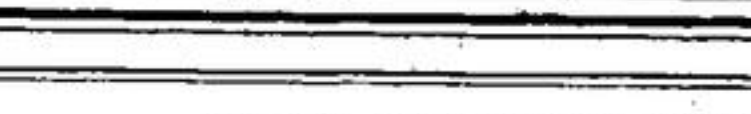
