Canadian Business Gains

Reflecting betterment in Canadian business, gain of more than 4 per cent, was shown in the business index for April which stood at 98.3 compared with 94.2 in the preceding month as computed by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on the base 1920 equals 100. The gain over the corresponding month of 1934 was reported as 6 per cent. The index is based on 45 factors measuring the trend of mineral production, manufacturing, construction, electric power and distribution. 
