# Menu Hints

Recipes for New and Novel Dishes: Household Ideas and Buggestions

BOMETHING NEW IN CHEESE CAKE Bon't you cometimes feel as though you were at your wits' end trying yto think of a new dessert your family would enjoy? Well, here's a suggestion for a cheese cake that is practically guaranteed to delight every member of the household. For such a "fancy looking" dessert it's remarkably easy to prepare, largely due to the novel use of corn flake crumbs in preparing the pastry. The same pastry recipe, by the way, can be used in making the crust for ples and tarts. Merely line the bottom and sides of the mold or pan with the mixture and bake in a moderate oven.

## CHEESE CAKE

14 cup butter 32 cup sugar 5 egg yolks (well beaten)

2 teaspoons lemon juice 1 teaspoon lemon rind 1 lb. cottage cheese

2 tablespoons cornstarch

14 cup cream 5 egg whites

Cream the butter and add the augar When thoroughly mixed, add the egg yolks, kmon juice and rind. Beat thoroughly. Put the cottage cheese through a colander or ricer several times until very fine. Add the cornstarch and cream. Combine with the first mixture. Fold in beaten egg whites. Press corn flake pastry in the bottom of a spring form mold. Pour in the cake mixture Sprinkle top with finely grated almonds augar and cinnanion. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees F.) until firm (about one hour),

CORN PLAKE PASTRY 1 cup corn flake crumbs 2 tablespoons butter

2 tablespoons sugar Put the corn flakes (4 cups full) through a food grinder, using the fine cutter. Then sift the crumbs. Measure crumbs after sifting. Cream the butter with the sugar and add the crumbs, kneading thoroughly. Prees into the bottom of mold, or a ple pan.



In Mainz on the Rhine still stards in its success." the first printing house of the world It is the Schoefferhof, formerly known as the Hof zum Humbrecht, in which the father of printing Johannes Gutenberg, first put his invention to practical use Here he printed his famous Bible of 42 Lines, also known ad the "Mazarin Bible," his first calendars and the "Poem On The Day of Judgment.' Among the few remaining mementoes of Gutenberg in Mainz is the Gutenberg Museum founded in 1900, which contains the reconstructed workshop of the inventor complete with reproductions of th primitive wooden printing blocks and implements used by the pioneer of printing over 500 years ago. Johannes Gutenberg derived his name from the house alled Hof sum Geutenberg in Mainz, in which he was born in 1398, and not, as previously recorded, from his mother's birthplace in Gutenberg.


