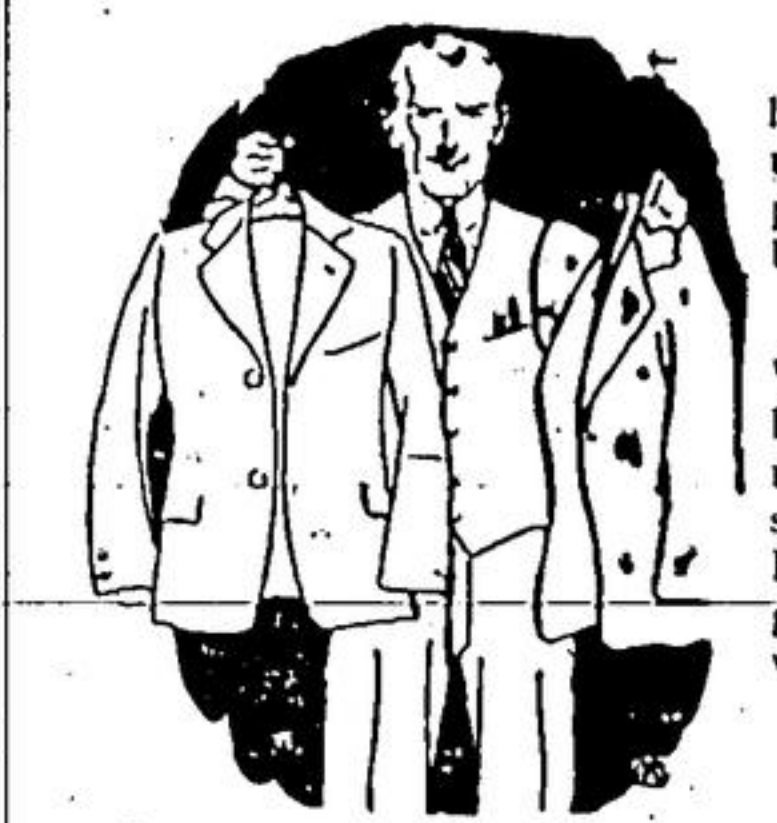
FACTS ARE FACTS
