PREVENT FIRES

These Simple Suggestions, if Followed by Everyone in the Family, Will Make Your Home Safe from Fire

Put lighted matches and smokes out before you throw them away. Keep matches where small children cannot reach them.

Remove rubbish, waste papers and all necessary combustible materials. Provide metal ash and trash cans.

Examine all stoves, furnaces, and smoke pipes to make sure they are safe and well away from woodwork or other burnable materials.

Value the advice of your fire chief who says that many fires are caused by dirty or defective chimneys.

Escape the danger of flammable liquid fires and explosions by keeping no gasoline in the house.

Notify the electric company of electrical trouble and the gas company of gas leaks. Replace "blown" fuses with new ones—not pennies.

Teach everyone in the family to be careful of fire, to watch stoves, fire-places, electric irons and all other possible fire causes.

Fireproof your home as far as possible by fire-safe roofing, fire stopping in hollow walls and partitions to stop the spread of flame.

Remember always where the nearest fire alarm box is and how to send an alarm. If telephoning, be sure the address is clearly understood.

HINTS ON STAINS

For grass stains use cold water; soap and cold water, or alcohol. For black coffee and tea stains use boiling water, bleaching if necessary.

For creamy kinds of stains use cold water and then boiling water. For grease and oil stains use French chalk and blotting paper.

For iodine stains use warm water and soap, alcohol or ammonia. For ink stains try cold water, and then use an acid or a bleaching agent.

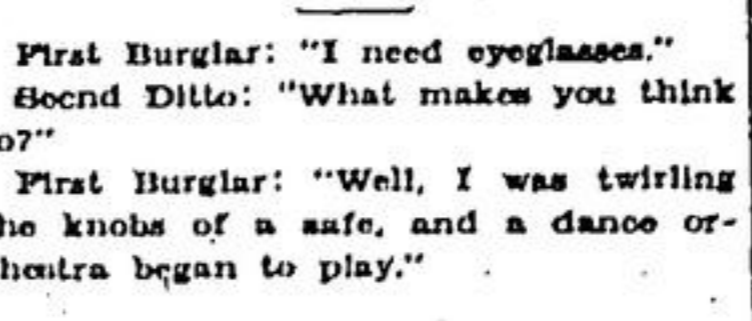
