Recipes for New and Novel Dishes; Household Hints and Suggestions

The following recipes each for 12 servings, are recommended for this time of the year when entertaining is general...

CRABMEAT SALAD

- 1 tablespoon gelatin, 1/4 cup cold water, 1 cup pineapple juice, 1 lemon (juice), 1 can crabmeat, 1 cup white cream or cottage cheese, 1 cup whipping cream, Pinch of salt...

MOULDED CHICKEN SALAD

- 2 tablespoons gelatin, 1/4 cup cold water, 1 cup cooked salad dressing or mayonnaise, 1 cup whipping cream, 1 cup Malaga grapes, pineapple, orange or grapefruit...

TOMATO CHEESE SALAD

- 2 tablespoons gelatin, 1/4 cup cold water, 1 1/2 cups tomato juice, 1 slice of onion, 1 bay leaf, 1 cup tomato juice, 1 cup cream or cottage cheese, 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, Salt to taste, 1 cup whipping cream, Few pepper berries...

CANADIAN APPLES IN APPLE PIES The following apple recipes, prepared by the Fruit Branch, Dominion Department of Agriculture...

RUSSIAN APPLE PIE

Bake 8 large tart Canadian grown apples; rub through a sieve, chill. Add 1/2 cup sugar and the whites of 5 eggs beaten stiff with a few grains of salt...

MOTHER'S APPLE PIE

Fill the space between the crusts with Canadian grown apples, sliced thin, rounding up the slices so as to make a very full pie...

ENGLISH APPLE PIE

Butter a shallow granite dish, deeper than a pie plate; fill the dish with sliced Canadian grown apples...

On the tenth day of JANUARY, 1875, just sixty-one years ago, I entered upon what proved to be my life work—beginning at Arthur, Ontario, with Rev. R. Phillips as my first Superintendent.

An incident of much interest to me occurred about mid-way between the above date and the present and of which I have not made any previous record. The London Conference was being held in Windsor, June 1906. On my arrival...

At that Conference I was also elected a member of the General Board of Missions for the Quadrangle. Its members, ministerial and lay, were of the best. To be associated with them in counsel, and in practical work was a privilege much appreciated at the time and thankfully remembered now.
