CANADA'S EXPORTS UP

Canada's exports during May had a value of \$83,819,751 compared with \$85,498,251 in May a year ago, an increase of \$1,678,500, or 2 per cent. Exports to British Empire countries amounted to \$40,867,687 compared with \$31,970,000, an increase of 28 per cent; while exports to foreign countries amounted to \$42,952,064, compared with \$53,519,751, an increase of 28 per cent.

NINE MILES OF NEW HOUSES

Although construction work in Canada, as in other countries, has been in the doldrums in recent years, a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics shows that in 1934, at the very ebb of the depression, expenditures on new dwellings in Canada amounted to \$9,207,913. If most of this expenditure was on modest homes, with an average value of five thousand dollars, it would account for 1,840 homes, and if these homes were built on fifty-foot lots, on both sides of the street, they would form an avenue of new buildings nearly nine miles long.

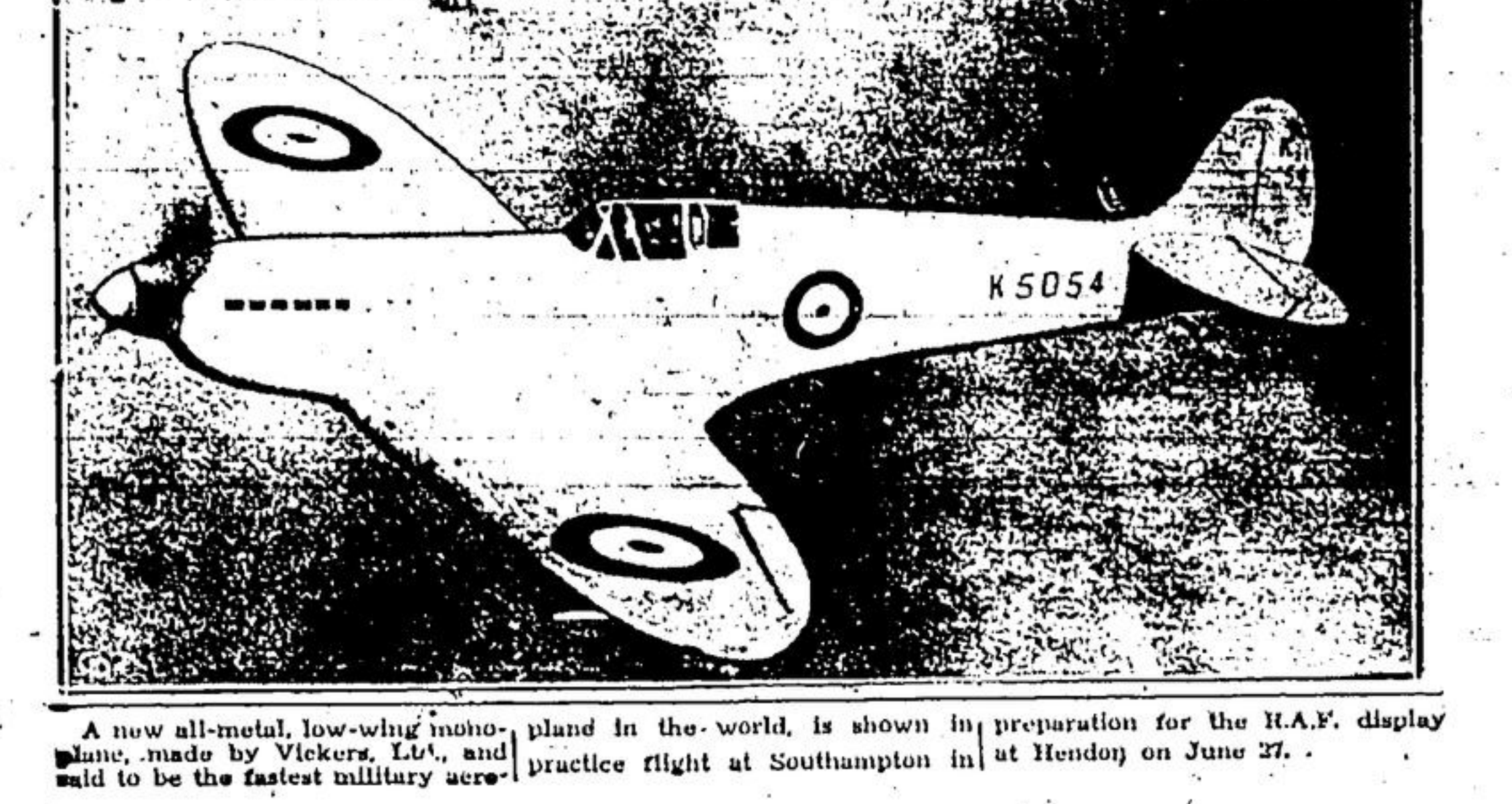
