FEDERAL SALARIES.—The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States receives a salary of \$10,500 per year; eight associate justices receive each \$10,000 per year; the marshal a salary of \$3,000. In the Court of Claims there are five judges who receive each a salary of \$4,500. The chief clerk of this court receives \$3,000; assistant clerk, \$2,000; bailiff, \$1,500; messenger, \$720. In the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, the Chief Justice receives \$4,500, and there are five associate justices, who receive each \$4,000 salary.
