



LINDEN, BETWEEN PROSPECT AND HAZEL AVENUES.



The above view is one of the many beautiful ones which abound in the Park. It is taken from the rise in Linden avenue, just in front of C. W. Kirk's elegant home, which is half a block north of the Military Academy drill hall. The view is to the north, down into the head of the ravine, whose depth, even here, does not fully show in the cut. Just at the right, across the ravine, is the fine residence of City Attorney K. R.

Smoot; on the left is the spacious home of Banker George D. Boulton; the church, whose tall spire stands yonder on the right, is the Presbyterian house of worship, whose pastor, Rev. S. M. Johnson, preaches to the largest congregation in the city; to the left of the church is the beautiful Hazel Park, on the north side of which are the Episcopal and Baptist meeting houses. In the centre

of that little Hazel park we hope ere long to see a fine fire-proof public library building, worthy of this city, and in which, with the passing years, can be gathered the choicest wisdom of the ages! The building, of course, does not show in this cut, but it will ere long. This view is about three blocks, or an eighth of a mile from the lake shore.
