E. H. Denison for some five and twenty years a resident and honored citizen of this city, died Sunday Feb. 14, at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. Geo. Hall, in Sioux city, Iowa, aged about 75 years. He was an eastern man by birth but was for years connected with the Holt Lumber Co. of the N. Ludington Lumber Co. in Chicago. Mr. Holt, now of Lake Forest, says he is the only man he ever allowed to sign his name to cheques, etc. That service with those lumber companies was his life work. He came to the Park to live first upon St Johns avenue and in later years down in his own home on Prospect avenue. He was for many years a leading member of the Pres-

byterian church: for two years our city treasurer. About a year ago he rented his house and went to live with Mrs. Hall in Sioux city. He leaves beside his widow, a son Henry, now of Phillips, Wisconsin, and Mrs. Hall of Sioux city. The funeral was held in the church at Lake Forest, Tuesday afternoon, conducted by his pastor, S. M. Johnson of this city, and by his friend, Rev. Dr. McClure of Lake Forest. The interment was in the Forest cemetery. He was a good man in all respects.
