

ALL GOING TO THE CIRCUS.

Everybody is talking about Ringling Bros famous big circus, which is to be at Evanston, Saturday, July 17th. Several big excursions will go from this vicinity and the popularity of the show will insure an enormous crowd. Mrs. Henrietta A. Davis, widow of the late Judge W. S. Davis, died at her home on Park avenue Monday afternoon July 5th, 1897. She had been suffering from paralysis for a year or two but her death was the immediate result of prostration from last week's extreme heat. She and her husband came here in 1869 some 28 years ago. She was a native of New Jersey where she was born June 1, 1834. Two daughters survive her, Emma; wife of W. P. Rutherford of Chicago, and Hattie, wife of Edward Laing of this city. The funeral was Wednesday from Trinity church and interment at Rose Hill.

Mrs. Davis was one of those quiet retiring, home keeping women and consequently but little known to and by the world at large, but she was one whom all esteemed and loved who knew her, by whom her gracious memory will long be cherished.

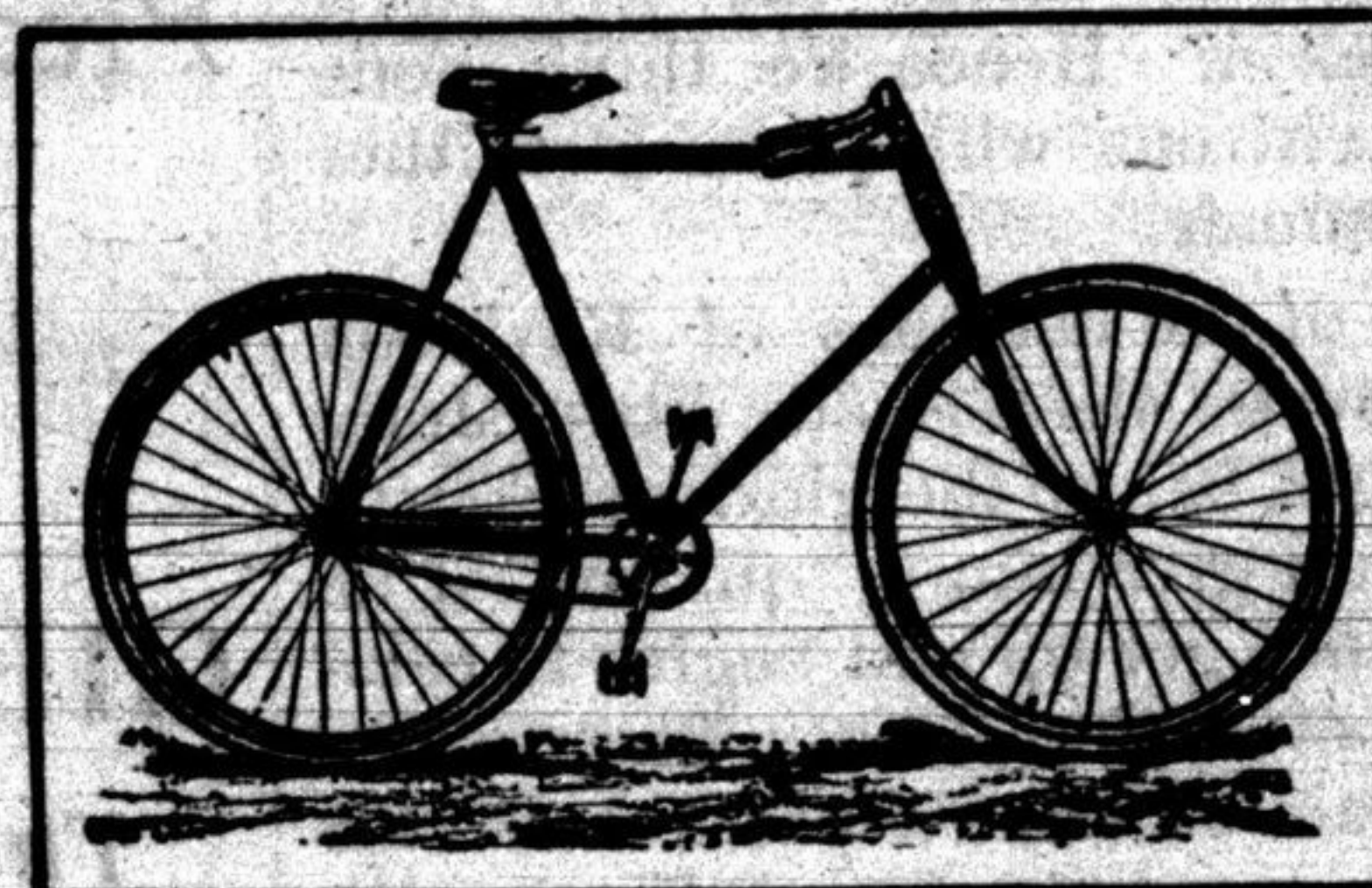
