hose tower and a small store room for the library, and over the vestibule would be a small committee room, for the aldermen or any other good use. This is a general outline of the plans; we have spent some time in looking over carefully in detail and it seems to us to pretty completely cover the needs of the city now and for the future. The cost of these improvements Mr. Bock estimates at \$2,900. It would vary some but that is near enough for all practical purposes at this stage of the proceedings.

One or two suggestions now, and the rest next week. First, these enlargements, additions, etc., are an absolute necessity; everyone familiar with things knows that. Second, with one or two slight modifications, Mr. Bock's plans are complete. Third, these additions can be made this season cheaper than at any future time; labor and material are cheap and our men need the work. Fourth, long-time bonds, say 15 vears, can be issued, so that our descendants and successors will pay the bills, and we hardly feel the slight additional expense. Fifth and finally, the library board have the city "on the hip," and if the city council neglects or refuses to make these improvements, and provide a suitable library room and conveniences, this library board can go on, in spite of the city council or any one else, buy a lot, put up a building and issue bonds for the same and involve the city in an expense of from \$6000 to \$10,000, and we shall have it to pay. If the council will make these Bock improvements, the library board will be satisfied. More next week.
