

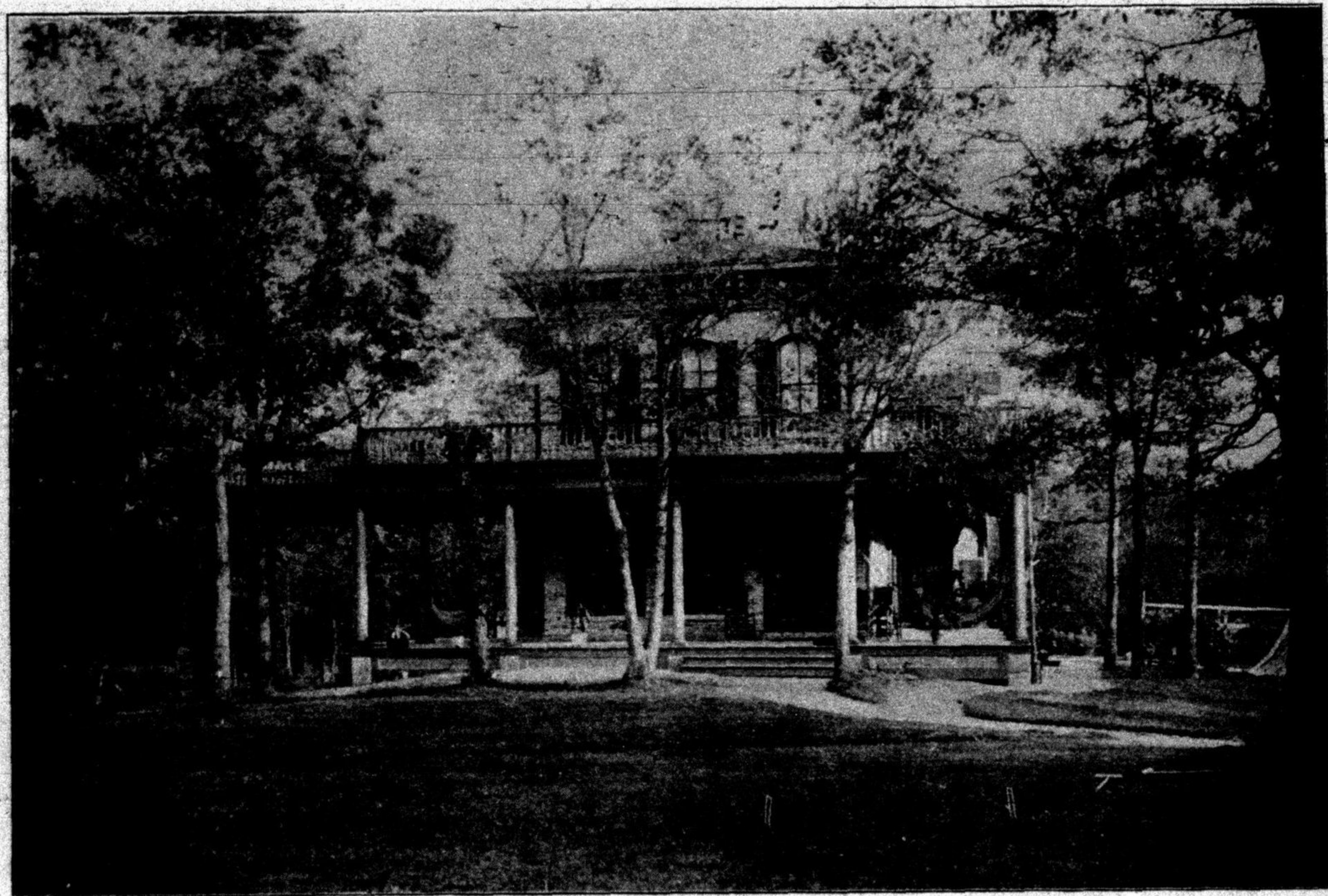
**GEORGE B. CUMMINGS,**
