PUMPING STATION REPORT.

The following report for November of water pumped and oil used, in gallons.

Total pumped 7,280,790
Daily average 242,693
Total oil used 5,172
Daily average 172
C Ry Co 100,000
Raffen & Baker's pond 700,000
Sewer flushing 1,300,000

The engineer estimates that one gallon of fuel oil pumps 1,407 gallons of water. One new tap has been put in: 692 of 10 inch and 194 feet of 6-inch water mains have been laid. The water was bad during the month as it was at the other pumping stations on this lake shore. The cost of pumping the water wasted in frequent flushings of the water mains for the month would at least pay half the cost of a filtering bed, so all the water pumped would be carefully filtered.

The large pumpage during the month was owing to the frequent flushing of the mains to clean out the dirt, and the filling of Raffen & Baker's ice pond. One sewer connection has been made. We shall refer to the filtering business next week.
