### HOW HARTMAN LOST HIS LIFE.

Referring to the death of Private Max Hartman, which occurred at Ft. Sheridan Thursday night, J. W. Mauck, of the Chicago & Milwaukee Electric Road says: "We have on file statements from passengers on the car in question, including the companions of Hartman, and a gentleman in Highwood who witnessed the affair and assisted in carrying Mr. Hartman after he was hurt. These all agree that Mr. Hartman and his two companions got off the car at the C. &N. W. switch leading into the fort, the car at a full stop until they were safely on the ground, clear of the car, the conductor assisting Mr. Hartman out and then proceeded on his course. The other two soldiers then tried to carry Mr. Hartman (badly intoxicated) down the C. & N. W. switch track and had gone some distance when he slipped from their grasp, his head striking between the two rails of the C. & N. W., inside the fort grounds."
