A concert will be held in the Ebenezer church next Tuesday evening, under the auspices of the Sunday school. A very fine program has been arranged and everyone is invited to attend.

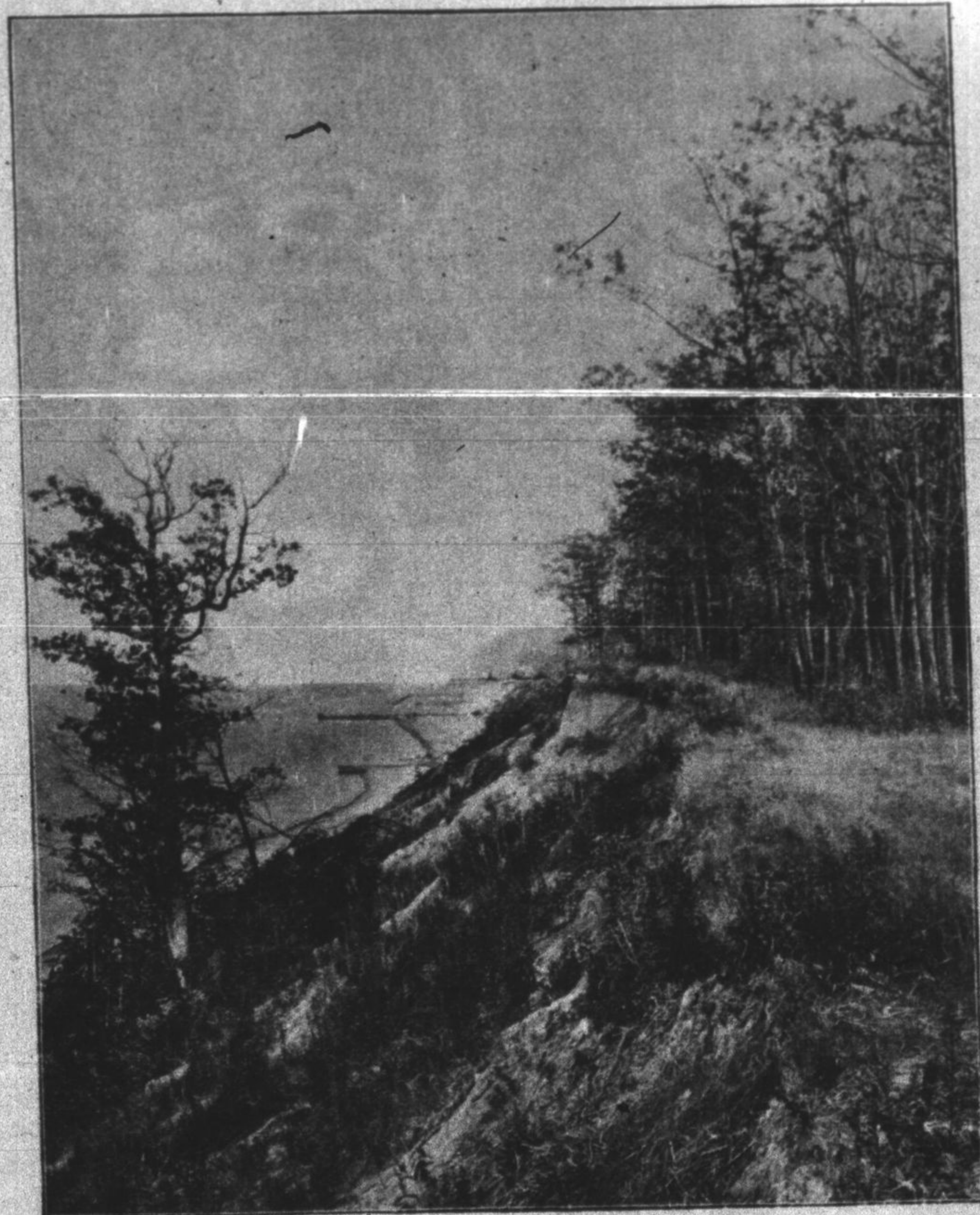
