WILL THEY ENLARGE?

The Kellogg Switchboard company, manufacturers of telephones and electrical devices, now located in the Gray Electric building are said to have in contemplation the erection of an extensive manufacturing plant in the vicinity of their present factory.

This concern has reached an advanced position in the electrical manufacturing and supply business, and are operating under patents which place them in the position of active competitors to the Bell monopoly.

They have recently installed several telephone plants of large capacity and are also said to be the concern seeking a competitive Chicago franchise.

The Kellogg company has no local interest in Highland Park, other than it being a convenient point for their manufacturing department. They leased the Gray Electric works before their business had assumed great magnitude and now are said to find it to their advantage to build in Highland Park the extensive plant which their growth has made imperative. Several localities have offered a bonus in the shape of free sites etc. to secure the plant of the Kellogg Company, and under ordinary circumstances liberal offers of this na ture would probably receive careful. consideration. The facts presumably are that the filling of their contracts would be materially delayed if they were to seek a new location and that they will be forced to build at once and build at Highland Park.

To a great extent the resident people of Highland Park fail to appreciate the local importance of this concern, but the merchants, and mechanics and owners of rental property realize that a concern constantly employing a large number of skilled people at liberal wages is a good proposition for encouragement.

Some idea may be gained of the magnitude of the contemplated plant from the fact that three hundred and fifty thousand brick will be required for the building. Should the company finally decide to make this their permanent location Ravinia and Highland Park realty within convenient distance of the plant will receive a decided stimulus.
