**ONWENTSLIA.**

**AIR LINE FOR THE ELECTRIC ROAD.**

The Chicago & Milwaukee electric road will ask the Highland Park council to grant them a right of way on Railway avenue from Cedar avenue south to the corporation line. The former route that branched in toward the lake at Lincoln avenue was found to be impracticable, and the electric road people accordingly purchased the right to run over private property east of St. Johns avenue. They now require only two blocks and a half to complete the "air line" to connect with this south line to Evanston. The request certainly seems reasonable and in the interest of all concerned. The completion of the electric road will be of great advantage to the North Shore
