The lake is nine miles in width and fiffar north as Minneapolis to enjoy the unexcelled duck shooting. The well known Black Hawk Gun Club of Milwaukee has its substantial club house within a few hundred feet of the Park club. The club house is well built having good bed-rooms for those of the members who go in the middle of the summer for the fishing and each member will have a locker in the basement room where the boats are also kept, the water reaching the lower part of the building on the front. There will be good spring beds, the members taking their own bedding. The club house will also contain a large and comfortable sitting room. Surely the members have some good sport ahead of them this year in such a hunter's paradise.
