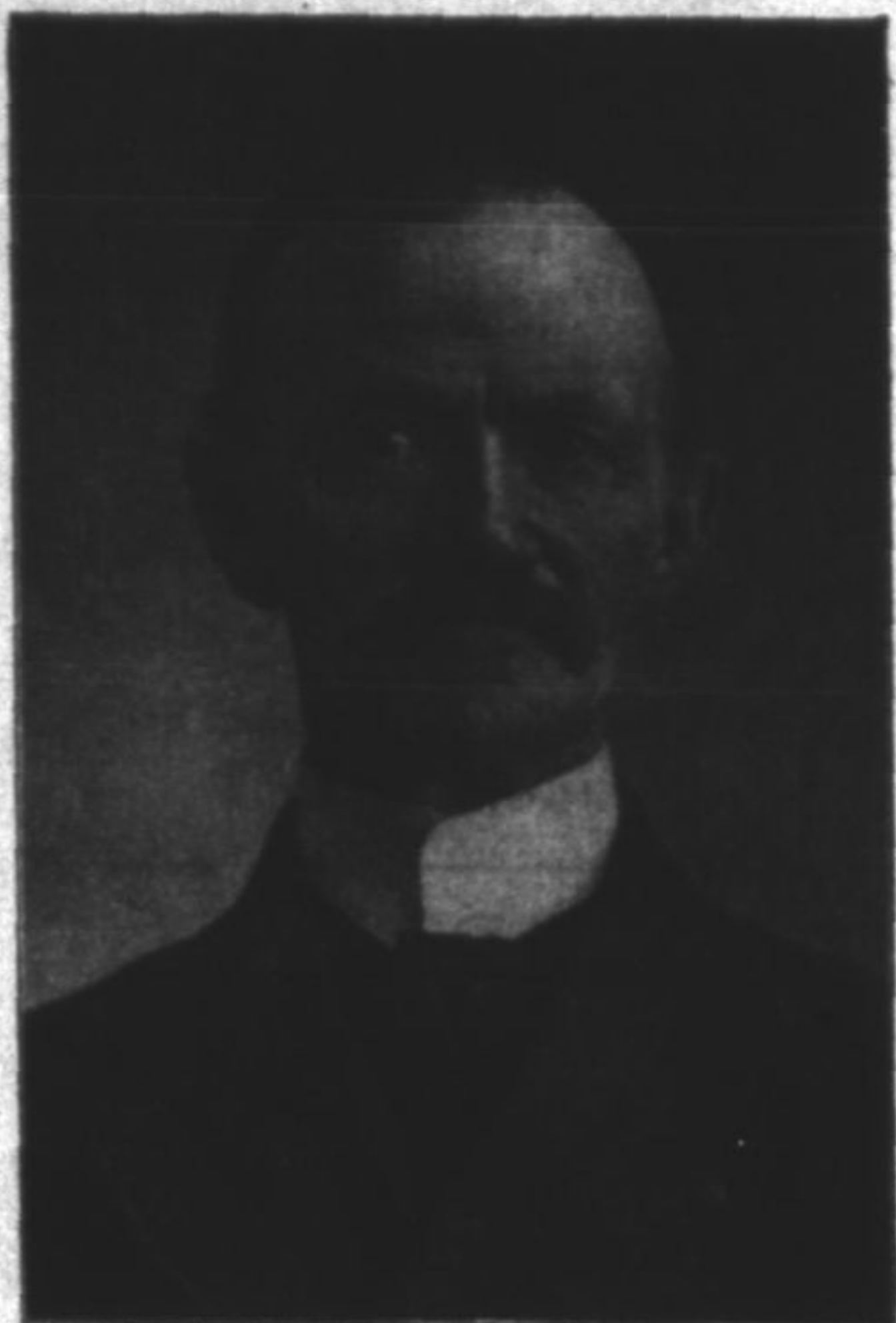


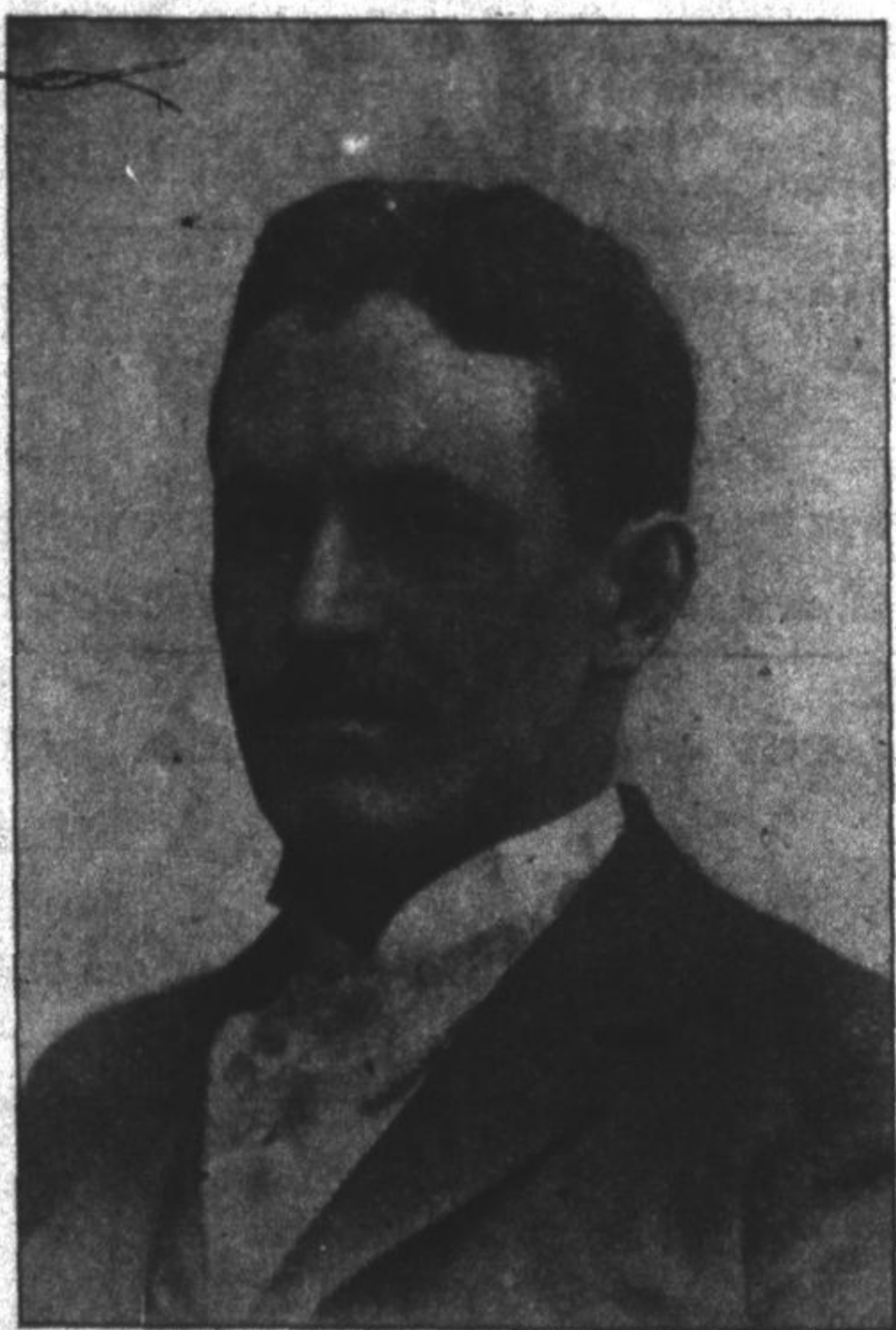
THE NEW COUNCIL.

didates, THE NEWS-LETTER had to postpone printing many of the candidates' photos. These illustrations are given this week. The newly



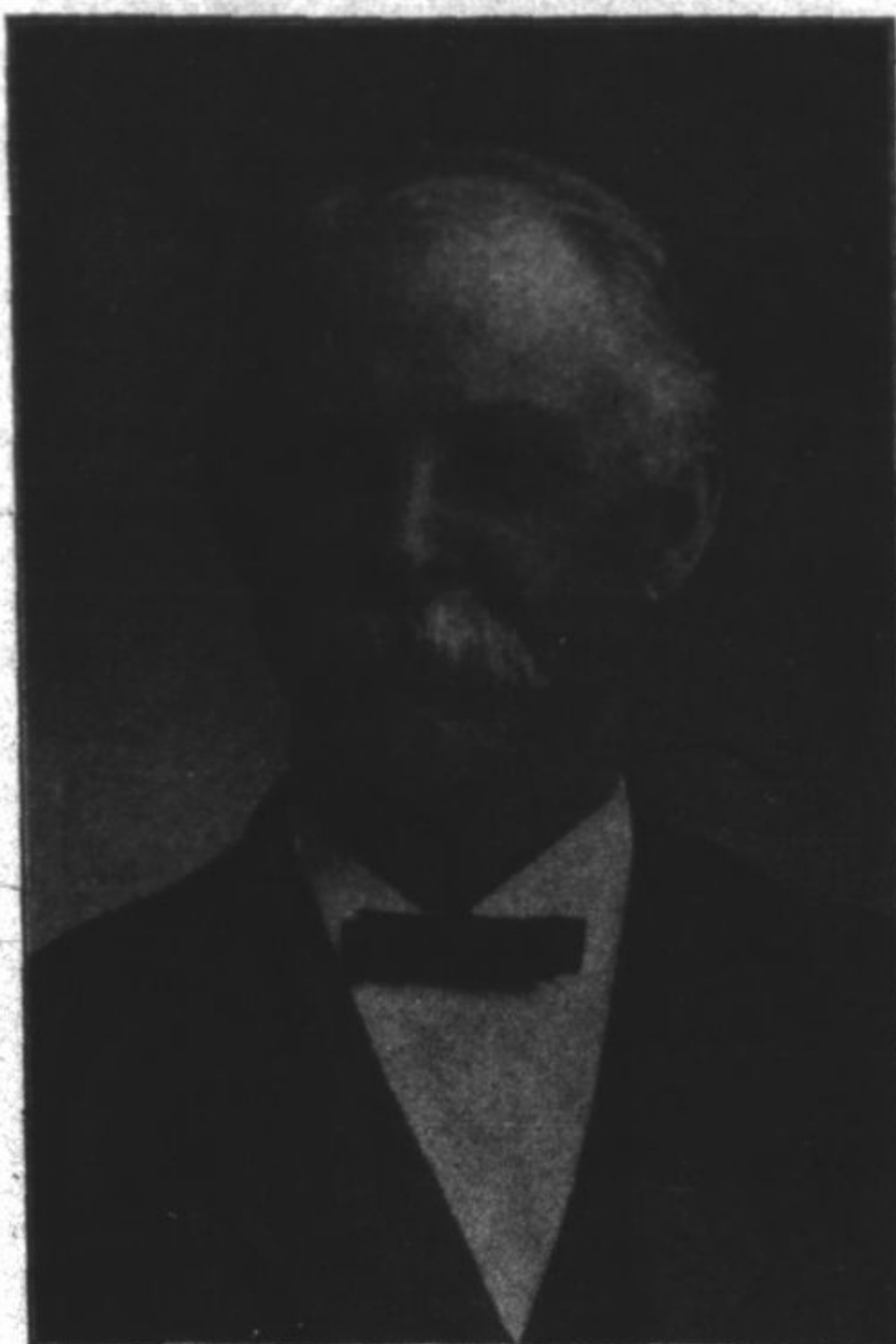
CITY ATTORNEY-ELECT S. F. KNOX.

Mayor-Elect Daniel Cobb

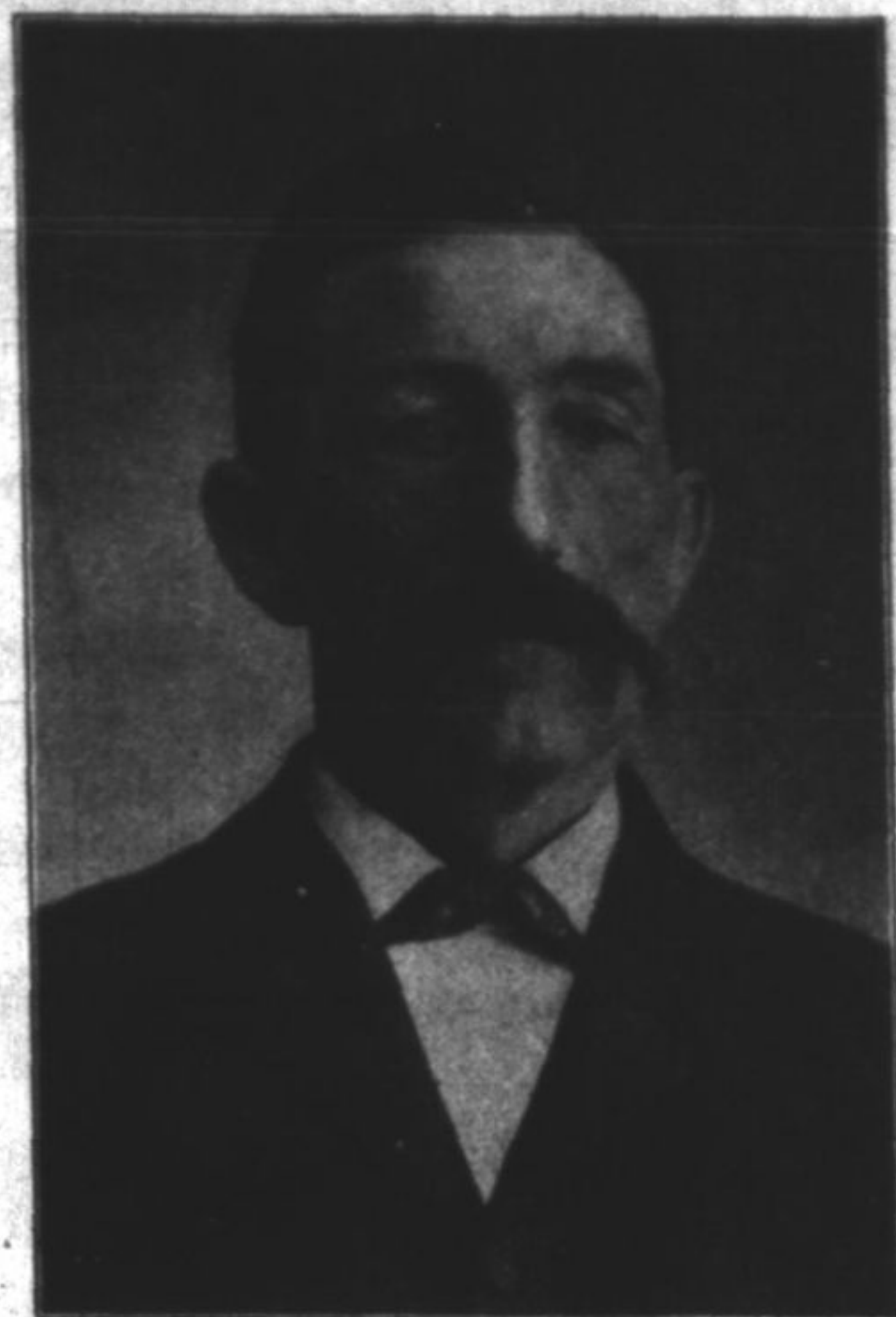

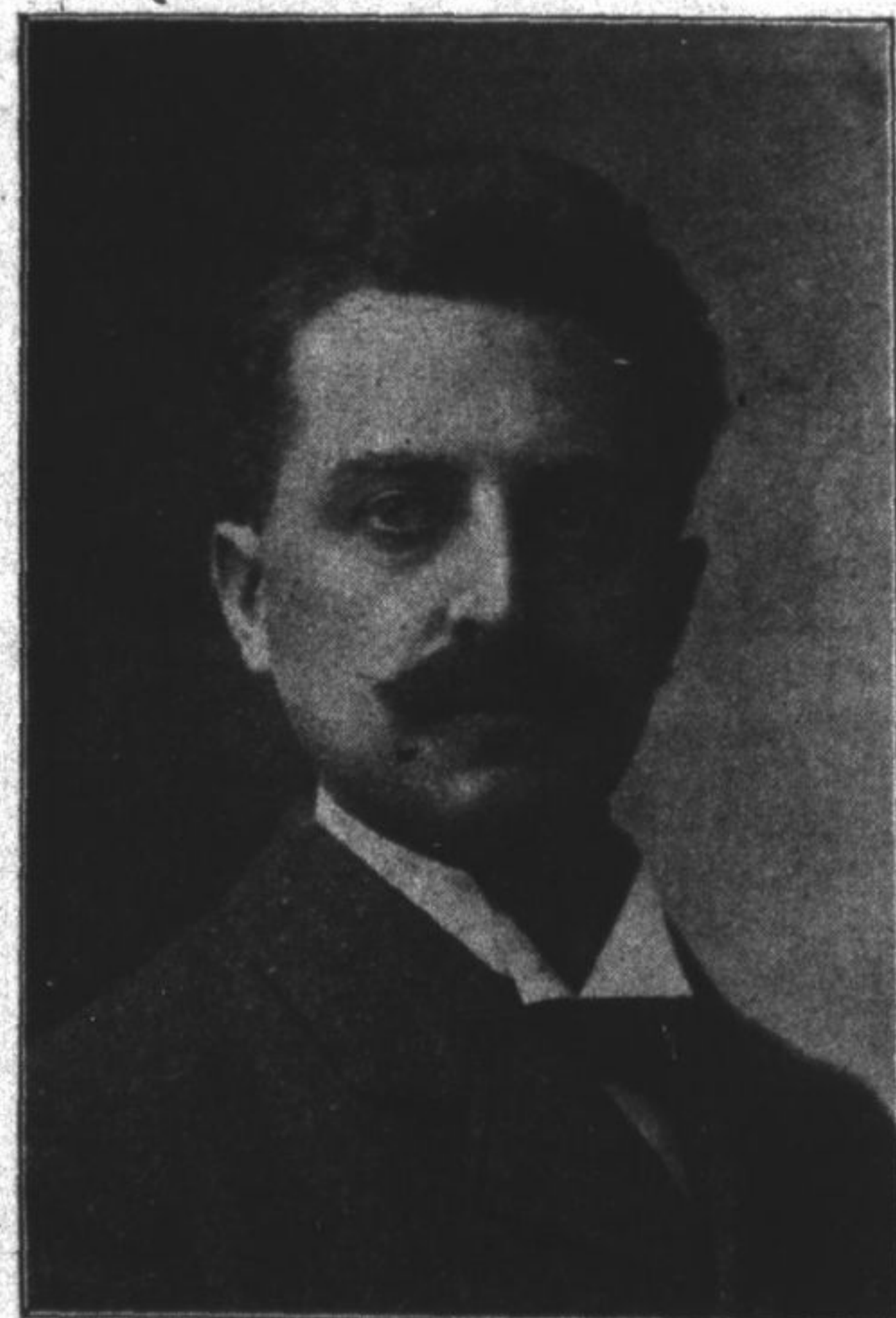
Mr. S. F. Knox,
