OBITUARY.

On April 24, at Houghton, Mich., Sheldon Douglas Gilbert passed away after a brief attack of spinal meningitis. The deceased was the eldest child of Mr. and Mrs. Edwin S. Gilbert, and born in Houghton November 24, 1874. His mother was the daughter of the late Ransom Sheldon, and died when he was but six years old. Shortly after this the family moved to Illinois. The latter settled in Winnetka. Sheldon Gilbert was a graduate from the

Northwestern University; from this place of learning he entered the law department of Yale College, where he received his diploma in 1897. Mr. S. Gilbert was admitted to the practice of law in Michigan and Illinois. He took great interest in athletic sports and was a member of Northwestern University foot ball team in 1895 and 1896.

Mr. Gilbert afterward accepted a position as private secretary to his uncle, D. Sheldon, shortly after his election to Congress, over two years ago.

Edwin Gage and Miss Thera I. Gilbert are left to mourn his untimely end.

The funeral was held April 26 from Trinity Church. Services were conducted by Rev. J. E. Curzon. The remains were laid to rest beside the mother's at Forest Hill, Michigan.
