June 16th, Saturday, -2 p.m., Members' Handicap. Eight en hole "Ball Sweep." Each entrant to deposit two new balls marked with his initials in a box. Wi mer to receive two-thirds of the balls, second man the remainder.

June 17th, Saturday, -2p. m., Open Tournament (all entries scratch;) eighteen holes medal play. Open to players who have learned the game in America and who are members of clubs within a radius of thirty-five miles of Chicago. Prizes for first and second best score

June 24th, Saturday, -2 p. m, Team Match. Exn oor vs Riverside, at Exmoor. Teams to consist of eight men each.

July 4th, Independance Day, -9 a. m., and 2 p. m. Members' Handicap. Thirty-six holes medal play. Prizes for best net score and best gross score.

July 15th, Saturday, -2 p. m. Members' Bogey Handicap. Eighteen holes match play against Colonel Bogey. Prize for best score.

August 5th. Saturday. - 2 p. m. Members' Handicap. Eighteen holes medal play. Prize for best net score.

August 12th, Saturday,—2 p. m. Team Match Exmoor vs Riverside at Riverside.

August 19th, Saturday, - 2 p. m, Members' Bogey Handicap. Eighteen holes match play against Colonel Bogey. Prize for best score,

September 4th, Labor Day — 9 a. m. and 2 p. m., President's Cup Contest (handicap) for members. Thirty-six holes medal play, sixteen best scores to qualify for match play. Prize for best gross score.

September 29th, Friday—10 a. m. and 2 p. m., women's open tournament (all entries scratch), 18 holes medal play, morning and afternoon; open to members of clubs within a radius of 35 miles of Chicago. Prizes for first and second best scores.

September 30th, Saturday—2 p. m., driving contest for members; each contestant to drive three balls which must fall within parallel lines drawn 120 feet apart, otherwise no count; prize for best average. 3 p. m., approaching contest for member; each contestant to hole out three balls placed 75 yards from the hole; prize for best average.

October 7th, Saturday -- 2 p. m., mixed foursome handicap for members: 18 holes medal play; prize for best net score.

October 21st, Saturday-2 p. m., members' bogey handicap; 18 holes match play against Colonel Bogey. Prize for best score.
