

**Circuit Court Docket.**

The docket for the October term of court is out. Court will convene next Monday, October 2nd, with Judge Charles H. Donnelly presiding, in all probability.

The docket is a large one and contains 255 cases all told. On the criminal docket are 26 people's cases, but some of the more important ones will doubtless not be tried, unless Thomas R. Myers, Peter Gorman, John Powell and George Snyder return in time to appear. No word has been heard from them and the authorities are wondering what is the matter. The case against old Tom Dugdale, for assault with a deadly weapon is on, and there are embezzlement, larceny and assault cases of all descriptions.

The case of the people vs. Albert Weber, the ticket thief, who was caught here some months ago, will create a little excitement probably. Barney Lofhink and Edward Bergmann will be on trial as the horse-thieves of the jail-bird aggregation.

The case of George Krueger, for the murder of his wife and mother-in-law, may and may not be tried. It is on the docket.

In the common law department 93 cases are scheduled.

The Dunn-DeKay case is on and it will probably be re-tried.

The damage suit of Leonard vs. the Thomas Brass & Iron Works is also to be tried, and there are three damage suits against the city of Waukegan with Mary J. Count, Elizabeth McGrain and Frank Whaples as the respective plaintiffs.

The case of the village of Fort Sheridan against its treasurer for debt, J. F. McDonough is on the docket. This case may be settled out of court.

The mandamus case of the city of Waukegan vs. John M. Foote, county treasurer, will be of interest. F. C. Rogers will represent the city and Coon & Ovis appear for Mr. Foote.

On the chancery docket are 136 cases. Eleven of them are bills for divorce.

Mr. McLaughlin has purchased the Dorothy house.
