It was said by the critics of the English press "that the style in its homely simplicity and vigor reminded all who read of Swift," who recalls the "Backwoodsman," "Komnpmarke or old times in New York," "The merry tails of the three worse men of Gotham," "The book of St. Nicholas," "The New Pilgrims Progress," "Westward Ho" (not Kinglesy's) "Slavery in the United States," "The life of Washington addressed to the youth of the United States."
