SIDEWALK ORDINANCE.

For sidewalk on the westerly side of Second street from Central avenue, northerly until it connects with sidewalk in front of lot 4, block 7.

BE IT ORDAINED by the city council of the City of Highland Park:

Sec. 1. That a sidewalk be constructed on the westerly side of Second street immediately in front of the following described lots or parcels of land:

Lot five (5), lot six (6), lot seven (7), lot eight (8), lot nine (9), lot ten (10), lot eleven (11), lot twelve (12), lot thirteen (13), lot fourteen (14), lot fifteen (15), in block seven (7), in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake, and State of Illinois, and that the whole cost thereof be levied upon such lots or parcels of land, in proportion to their frontage upon such

sidewalk. Sec. 2. Said sidewalk shall be constructed under the supervision of the foreman of streets, and subject to his approval, as follows: To be of two-inch pine plank of sound quality, free from sap or rotten knots, the width of each plank to be uniform and not less than six nor more than ten inches wide, laid crosswise, made even, and planed on the top surface, the width of said walk to be five feet and four inches, and the inner and outer edge in a straight line, the inner edge of said walk to be eighteen inches from the lot line, said plank to be nailed on three bear ings of pine joists of sound quality, two feet apart, of three by four inches, each plank to be nailed to the bearings with six thirty-penny nails, two in each bearing, the outer bearing to be two inches from the edge of said walk, and when blocked up, such blocking to be done with pieces of new sound plank, twelve inches long, and six feet apart, spiked to the bearings and to each other when more than one piece is used. The grade of said walk shall be fixed by the city engineer and all persons desiring the grade shall apply to said engineer for the same.

Sec. 3. All owners of lots or parcels of land aforesaid, are hereby required to construct said sidewalk, in front of their respective land, within thirty days after date of publishing this ordinance; and in default thereof, said materials to be furnished and sidewalk constructed by said city.

Sec. 4. Said foreman streets shall certify to a bill of the cost of such sidewalk constructed by said city, showing in separate items the cost of grading, materials, laying down and supervision, and file it in the office of

the city clerk, together with a list of the lots or parcels of land touching upon the line of the said sidewalk, the names of the owners thereof, and their frontage on said sidewalk.

Sec. 5. The city collector is hereby designated the officer to collect the special tax herein provided, and to whom the warrants for the same shall be directed.

Sec. 6. The city clerk shall comply with the provisions of "An act to provide additional means for the construction of sidewalks in cities, towns and villages," in force in Illinois, July 1, A. D. 1875, and if any land is delinquent after return of warrant by said city collector, then said clerk shall make report of all such special tax, in writing, to the county treasurer and ex-officio county collector, prior to April 1, 1900, as required by said act.

CITY COUNCIL.

The meeting was largely attended by citizens; Alderman Van Riper, owing to illness, could not attend. Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

The owners of the Waukegan gas plant were present and submitted a proposition to the council for permission to lay pipes in the streets.

On motion of Alderman Obee, Mr. Osborne, one of the Waukegan men, was asked to address council on the subject. Mr. Osborne stated that it was the wish of the company to furnish gas to the towns along the line, that 20 miles (a majority) of Highland Park frontage had already been secured; that the company had a new and up-to date plant, the capacity of which could furnish gas for a city of 50,000 people. He promised to furnish the same for \$1.25 per thousand feet, the same price as paid by Waukegan, and he thought that as the demand for their product increased they would be enabled to supply it at a lower rate. The ordinance was referred to street and alley committee.

Mr. F. W. Cushing asked permission to lay a 4-inch water pipe some 250 feet to his new hotel and as he intends using the water in large quantities, Mr. Cushing thought himself entitled to wholesale rates. Referred to fire and water committee.

Mr. N. D. Lighthall asked for permission to build a drain for the Highwood M. E. church. Referred to street and alley committee.

One of the gentlemen recently fined for violating a city ordinance asked for return of \$5.00 paid by him. Referred to street and alley committee.

Miss Emma G. Turnley asked for data concerning the improvement of old Port Clinton through the Lightner lots at a point above Bloom street. She wished the names of committee who condemned the land. Alderman Obee moved that it be referred to street and alley committee, city clerk and attorney, which was done.

Mr. F. W. Schumacher was granted permission to extend the cement sidewalk in front of his store to the curbing.

Ravinia citizens asked permission to construct a wood sidewalk
