To say that man does not love from a gross point is a gross insult to every gentleman and equally to the mother who bore him. A Public Discussion.

Some one has proposed that Col. Davidson hold a public discussion of the issue in the 3rd ward. There is only one issue and that is: whether, after the people there have in a fair, free and full election voted for Col. Davidson as alderman, the mayor and four aldermen shall turn him out, because they do not like him and do not want him in the council, all in an illegal and unlawful manner. That is the simple and only issue, it is not St. Johns avenue or weather Col. Davidson is an Episcopalian or a Baptist or a Presbyterian, all these have nothing to do with it. We repeat it, the one and only issue is whether four aldermen and the mayor shall override and set aside the law, defeat the express will of the voters of the 3rd ward by ousting the alderman whom those voters elected just because they and a few others do not like him.

Every candid, honest man knows in the light of the law and the decisions of the Supreme courts, as cited and stated by Messrs. Smoot and Cole, that no court of competent jurisdiction would for a moment sustain such actions. The court would interpret and enforce the law and compel the mayor and these aldermen to respect the will of the people.

This being the issue, what occasion is there for any discussion? People don't want public discussions as to whether it is right to steal, every one knows it is not. There is no question as to whose right it is to rule, the people or the mayor and four aldermen; of course the administration, now that it sees what it has done and how the people take it, want to sidetrack the real issue, their unlawful conduct, and get the people to looking at the other and side issue which really has nothing to do with this case. Not at all gentlemen, your conduct in ousting Col. Davidson was illegal, unlawful, revolutionary, and therefore wrong in every particular and hence there is no discussion about it.

Oh, Yes; We Will.

Oh, yes, you wish to discuss which church polity is the best, the Episcopal or the Baptist or the Presbyterian, yes we will discuss that with you, and bring you over to our views also, but that has nothing to do with the third ward election. Or we will discuss whether St. Johns should be paved with brick or macadam, but that would not make lawful and right the turning of Col. Davidson out of the city council and so has nothing to do with this third ward election.

Why yes, we will discuss any discussible subject, but all the logic and eloquence of all the lawyers and politicians of the world would not make your illegal conduct in ousting Alderman Davidson lawful and right, any more than discussing the merits of black and white would change the colors.

Certainly discuss any legitimate subject, but that won't change the law or overthrow the decisions of the courts. The law and the courts condemn your conduct as illegal and wrong and that is the end of it.

The Scapegoat.

Now that the administration finds itself pressed into closer quarters for its misdeeds, and is looking about for a scapegoat, some one to be its mascot of evil. Hence when you speak to one of them, "oh, yes, we know what Knox is, but we are in for it and are going to make the best of it," etc. As a lawyer, he is not a brilliant success; indeed his knowledge of law is quite too small, for in serious city cases some one has been secured to help him. But for all that, he is entitled to decent treatment. He don't make as much pretence to social culture and condition as some others, but when it comes to real manliness and honesty, he is as good as the rest of them. He don't pretend to be a saint, and he is not a hypocrite, or what the scripture styles a whitened sepulchre. Now we believe in fairness and decency, and for these other members of the administration to attempt to throw all the blame for their blunders and misconduct generally, on Mr. Knox, is unfair and unjust. Don't tell us you are going to drop Knox, when he is as good a public official as you are. Drop Knox! The public will drop the whole of you at its first opportunity. Let us hear no more of Knox being the scapegoat; no scapegoat will save the present administration.
