**In Name Only.**

We were greatly mystified when handed a paper headed, "Highland Park Weekly Sun" and the mystery deepened when, after a thorough search through its eight pages we fail to find one item referring to Highland Park or its people. (Except legal notices.)

It reminds us of an experience we had in a printing office in the city: A young man called and wanted to if we would print him 30,000 slips or labels with the words "C— Young People for April 1898" and as our curiosity was aroused, we inquired the use he would make of such labels and after some effort we learned this trick in newspaper work. He was to take the 30,000 slips to a distributing agency. They were to put one in each package of advertising matter distributed by their boys until they had the labels all distributed then they would go before a notary public and make an affidavit that they circulated 30,000 copies of the "C— Young People for April 1898." The editor got out one or two hundred copies of his paper with which to "prove up" his "legal" notices and collect advertising contracts. The last we heard of this young man, he was "in the pen."

We suppose this so-called newspaper has a purpose in view in placing the name "Highland Park Weekly Sun, Vol LVI No. 2" at its head. It says it is "Republican to the backbone" (like the present prosperity) and "devoted to the destiny of Lake county," (and particularly Highland Park printing appropriation). What a fine "rake off" some people must have had last spring. The people of Highland Park will be having "Bath House John" or "Hinky Dink" out here if they should here how easy the people of this burg are.

In some states they require a paper to have a bonified circulation and published one year, before a legal notice inserted in it is binding and volume numbers don't go. An honest publication which has bonified circulation don't have to compete with any hatched up paper published to serve the interests of sore headed politicians.

The SHERIDAN ROAD NEWS-LETTER, published at Highland Park and covering several other towns in that region, has recently put in an expensive cylinder press, run by electric power, and is evidently flourishing like the proverbial green bay tree. It is an exceptionally newsy paper and deserves its success. —News-Herald, Rogers Park.
