Rev. Wm. E. Toll, rector of the Episcopal church in Waukegan, uttered a great truth Friday night when he said: "The great teachers of our big cities now declare that the moral law of God must be taught in our public schools if our nation is to be kept stable and not allowed to decline to corruption as have other nations where God's laws were forgotten." Some folks fear the principles of morality as laid down in God's word, the bible, will hurt our school children. Nothing else will save them and the nation, and such events as this attempted assassination make us see it.

All honor to the Chicago police force for refusing to release the arrested anarchist suspects on bail. To refuse may seem a drastic measure, but the occasion is drastic and the remedy must be commensurate with the peril. Riots and attempted assassination must be stopped if every suspect has to be hanged. There is and can be no such thing as liberty for anarchists; the two things cannot coexist; one or the other must perish.

An anarchist ran up and down the streets of Waukegan Saturday, shouting he was glad McKinley was shot, and the city police ran him into jail. This country is "awful big," but it has no room for anarchists.
