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Repairing Neatly Done
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TO THE VOTERS OF DEERFIELD TOWNSHIP:

An Election has been called for Township 43, Range 12, known as "Deerfield Township," Lake County, Illinois, to be held at the Highland Park Bank, corner of Central and St. Johns Avenues, in Highland Park, on Saturday, June 7, 1902, from 1 to 7 o'clock p. m., to vote "for" or "against"

the proposition to purchase Lots 5, 6 and 7, Block 35, in Highland Park, being the three lots adjoining the present High School property, and immediately north of same, with a frontage of 555 feet on St. Johns Avenue, and a depth of 240 feet to an alley. Also for or against the proposition to issue the bonds of said township for the sum of \$10,000, bearing not to exceed 5 per cent interest (they can probably be placed at 4 per cent), payable in annual installments of \$1,000 each, beginning August 1, 1904. The proceeds of said bonds to be used for the purchase of said real estate and the improvement of same.

The Board of Education deem it wise to purchase this property at the present time, as it is all vacant and can be purchased for the sum of \$7,000. If delay is made in the matter it may pass into other hands and be improved, so that it cannot be secured for High School purposes without paying a very much higher price.

If the clearing, grading and improving of the property can be done for less than \$3,000, we will issue less bonds than the amount called for. Our purpose in purchasing the property is to use it for an Athletic field in connection with the High School work. We have no property at present, nor are there any public grounds, where our students can engage in out-door athletics, and they are consequently hampered in that most popular department of their training. If we secure this field the general public will have an interest in it, and all the young men of the community will have a place for their athletic sports.

All modern high schools are making the athletic department a special feature of their work, and wherever they can do so are pro-

viding grounds for that purpose, as it has come to be a universally accepted fact that the physical development and training of our youth is fully as important as their mental culture.

If the judgment of the Board of Education is sustained at the polls and they are thus authorized to purchase the property named, it will be one of the most popular places for our young people

to assemble and engage in base ball, foot ball, track work and other out-door athletics, where not only the High School students themselves, but other young people of the township can assemble to take part in and witness such sports.

When it is considered that the expense of procuring this property will be borne by the entire townships of East and West Deerfield, and the cost to the individual taxpayers will be so small, and distributed over so long a space of time, it would seem as though every public spirited citizen would gladly VOTE FOR THE PROPOSITIONS.

Will you not therefore make a note of the time and place of this election and be on hand to cast your vote in favor of purchasing

the property named for the encouragement of the athletic spirit in our midst, and the benefit of the physical culture of our young people.
