NORTH SHORE NAVAL ACADEMY.

There has appeared in the daily press a notice of the incorporation of the North Shore Naval Academy, with Colonel Davidson Major Davidson and Dr. Rogers as incorporators.

A representative of the NEWS-LETTER called on Colonel Davidson and was informed that the announcement is correct; that such an institution has been incorporated under the laws of this state, and that it is the intention to have a summer session of two months as a sort of vacation school, using for the present the Military Academy buildings as a starting point.

The course will consist of drill with small boats, the use of naval guns, signaling, fencing, the study of sails, ropes and spars, knots, splicing, and reeving tackle, the use of log and lead line, charts, navigation with elements of astronomy involved, the use of the sextant determining latitude and longitude from the natural horizon afforded by Lake Michigan, phisiography — ocean, lake, etc., tides and currents, mineralogy, electricity and magnetism, botany and geology with much field work, modern languages, dancing, and an opportunity given students to make up any desired study.

It is planned to have about two weeks of the time spent at the Academy and the balance on board some large, safe boat. This boat will cruise the lakes, stopping at points of interest and an opportunity

will be given to visit the copper mines and other great enterprises which have an educational value. The whole work is to be in the hands of a graduate of the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis. We are informed that the plan is to meet with the hearty approval of prominent business and educational men and that some of the prominent government officials at Washington are interested in the matter. It will offer an opportunity

for the western boy to get some of that valuable training which young men acquire who live along the coast, and also enable them to spend a very enjoyable vacation.

In answer to our question the Colonel informs us that plans have been completed for the new mess hall, which will be a large brick building, 52x100 feet, fire-proof construction, and will be just north of the main building facing Sheridan Drive. The building will cost in the neighborhood of \$12,000. As most of the vacancies have been taken for the coming year, Colonel and Major are both spending their time in superintending the changes made necessary by the fire.

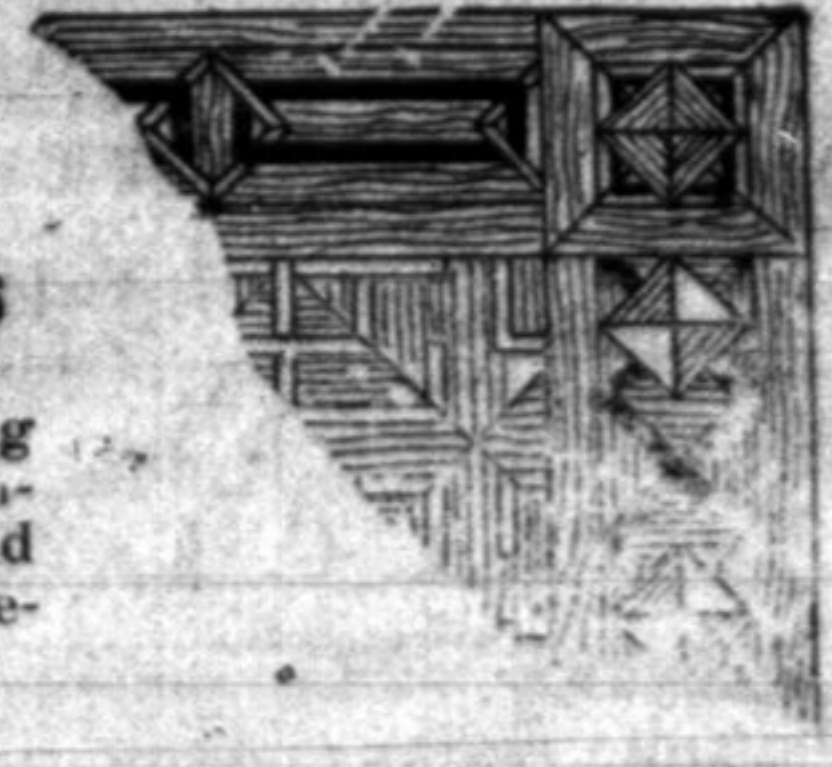
