CHICAGO, Aug. 27, 1902. John Finney, City Clerk, Highland Park, Ill -Dear Sir: -We send you herewith report of analysis of water received August 22. A comparison of this report with the result obtained on samples collected July 29 will show that there is considerable improvement over the samples of that date. The total number of bacteria is markedly decreased and the number of colon bacilli is less.
